Now telling lies seems to be a standard part of our daily life or work, at all levels. Even many people who claim to be spiritual are lying. We are moving towards systems that are based on lies. If there is no truth then there will be no mutual trust and this will lock up everything. How is it possible to do anything if everybody is lying and there is no mutual trust?! Perhaps 'computerize' everything? !

Look at the number of scam websites on the internet! I remember the case when I couldn't find a single web site that I could trust when I was looking for some service on the internet a few months ago! When people cannot be trusted even technology has no use. One can easily find many such examples. It has become much easier to find people and companies operating on the basis of lies than those operating on the basis of truth.

Truth is the basis for everything good, for every system, for every undertaking. We are in the age of information. But truth is not only information. It is different. Let us take a simple example. Suppose we want to help people who are really in need but we have only limited money. How do we know who is really in need of help? It is very difficult if we don't know the truth. On the Day of Truth we tell other people the truth we know. AND that person who has told the truth on the Day of Truth shall not get any punishment whatsoever for telling the truth.
