3.2. The hypothesis of the origin of cosmic vortices [5]

Space vortices (tornadoes, tornadoes) are of an energetic nature.

4. The Moon

4.1. Are you water, did you fall from the moon? [14].

4.2. The hypothesis of the cause of the appearance of moonquakes [1].

Hypothesis: the main cause of moonquakes is the movement of gravitational formations along the inner surface of the Moon's shell due to the influence of the "tidal" forces of the Moon and the Sun.

The most likely environment for gravitational formations is water (the ocean!), Moreover, the "tidal" movement of which causes high-frequency noise.

he presence, formation and movement of internal gravitational formations is a sign of the relative voidness and asymmetry of the Moon.

4.3. The hypothesis of the cause of the nonuniqueness of the sides of the Moon [6].

The unevenness of the sides of the Moon is due to the lack of axial rotation, as a result of which it is always facing one side to the Sun! This circumstance causes a one-way impact on the Moon of the Sun. The reason for the unevenness of the sides of the Moon is the unilateral influence of the Sun on it.

4.4. The hypothesis of the reason for the "movement" of dust storms on the Moon.

The reason for the "movement" of dust storms on the Moon along with the terminator (the boundary separating the illuminated and night side of the Moon) is a consequence of its lack of axial rotation [16].

Gravity formations simply "roll back and forth" along the bottom of the inner Lunar Ocean, and, consequently, dust storms move behind them!
