SOCIO – ECONOMIC SURVEY AND ITS OUTCOME

In order to ascertain the needs of the trainees for imparting training in the required trade a detailed socio – economic survey was conducted in Alankadavu & Kottur Malayandipattinam (J. J. NAGAR -ANGALAKURICHI). Totally 200 families were personally contacted and a detailed questionnaire response was elicited. In order to make the survey a foolproof one, the staff of the Scheme of Community Development through Polytechnics were utilized.

From the outcome of the survey, it was found that there is an overwhelming demand from women for training programmes likes Cutting & Tailoring, Embroidery, Soft Toys Making, Computer Data Entry Operator, DTP, Jute Soft Luggages, Natural Vinegar Preparation, Solar Coconut Copra dryer and Coir mate weaving. Similarly, among men there is a huge demand for the courses such as Computer Data Entry Operator, Electrical Wiring, Two Wheeler Repair & Maintenance, Mushroom Cultivation, CNC, General Machinist and R&AC. At present the above said courses are being offered either at Main centre or Extension Centre.

Very few people opted for courses like Coir & Paper Jewel Making, Bouquet Making, Wire bag knitting and Screen Printing.
